Happy St. Patrick's Day, and a solemn fifth Sunday in Lent and first Sunday of Passiontide (Deep Lent). The question is often raised when a lesser feast (yes, even for the Irish, St. Patrick's Day counts as a lesser feast) occurs on a Sunday, does it bump the Sunday observance and its Lectionary readings? The answer (in general) is "no". Even in places like Boston, Chicago, and Dublin, crosses are veiled, and they are reading about Jesus' upcoming crucifixion from the Gospel of John. This was not always so, but the church during the Reformation and Counter-Reformation began discouraging local celebrations from interfering with the Sunday liturgical calendar. Vatican II and our own 1979 prayer book reemphasized this. Since 1979, some restrictions have loosened. For example, in October we will celebrate the Feast of St. Francis on a Sunday. This is technically not permitted, but Episcopal Bishops have given latitude for such observances. There are times when feast days will trump the typical readings for all churches not just churches transferring an important observance to a Sunday. These are "Feasts of our Lord". Last year, this happened twice. The Feast of the Holy Name which is January 1<sup>st</sup> is not really thought of as being a huge church celebration, but because it is a Feast of our Lord, it bumped the Sunday of Christmas readings. The Feast of the Transfiguration whose traditional Anglican observance is August 6th did the same thing later in the summer.
