The Feast of Pentecost is June 8th. We will celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit this day. The Feast of St. Mary will be celebrated on Sunday, August 17th. On this holy day we will celebrate the life and continued importance of the mother of our Lord. We will flower the cross with blooms from our own gardens.
