The weather continues to look good this weekend, so we are going to plan on having Eucharist in the church as usual. Just a reminder, we do not have heat in the building, please dress appropriately. We will still be using the main door (Door 1) and the north door (Door 2) for entrance and exits. We are expecting to have our temporary railings on the north side of the building installed by the next Sunday we will be in the church. At that time, Door 1 will be closed and we will use Door 2 and Door 3 to enter and exit. Please remember that we will not be in the church on October 5th. We will be celebrating the Feast of St. Francis and both services will be held in St. Marv's Hall. Sunday, we celebrate Michaelmas, or The Feast of St. Michael and All Angels. Angels play a role in both the Old and New Testaments. There are many different kinds of angels, but the most well-known are the four Archangels Michael, Gabriel, Raphael, and Uriel. Tradition teaches that angels are spiritual beings created by God. They do not have physical bodies in the way we do. Other than worshipping God, Angels serve two other main purposes. First is by protecting the people of God. This could be done through healing or offering spiritual protection from evil and harm. Angels main function in scripture is as messengers. Our English word "angel" comes from the Greek word ἄγγελος meaning messenger. This is an ancient feast that has been one of the most celebrated over the centuries. In the Northern Hemisphere, it has been celebrated as a harvest festival. "Michaelmas Daisies" (aster flowers) were collected and brought into the church. Special cakes were often made. There is also a medieval tradition that we continue in the 21st century. The youngest clergy person in the parish dresses up like a dragon and the children of the church chase him away with the help of St. Michael who in the Book of Revelation defeats the power of darkness signified by the dragon. The children receive sweet treats for their efforts at protecting the parish.
